1. Limiting Liability

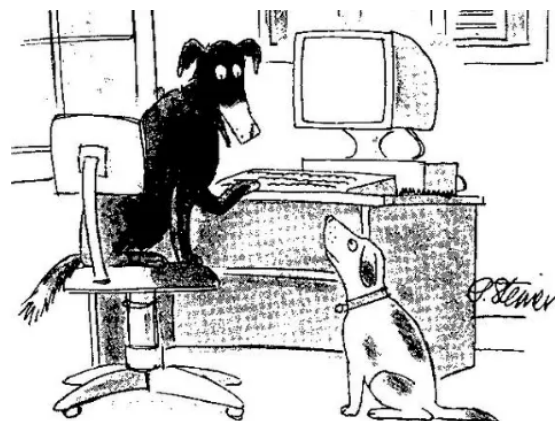
